VA'ETCHANAN

Deuteronomy 3:23–7:11

Moses tells the people of Israel how he implored G-d to allow him to enter the Land of Israel, but G-d refused, instructing him instead to ascend a mountain and see the Promised Land.

Continuing his "review of the Torah," Moses describes the Exodus from Egypt and the Giving of the Torah, declaring them unprecedented events in human history. "Has there ever occurred this great thing, or has the likes of it ever been heard? Did ever a people hear the voice of G-d speaking out of the midst of the fire . . . and live? . . . You were shown, to know, that the L-rd is G-d . . . there is none else beside Him."

Moses predicts that in future generations the people will turn away from G-d, worship idols, and be exiled from their land and scattered amongst the nations; but from there they will seek G-d, and return to obey His commandments.

Our Parshah also includes a repetition of the Ten Commandments, and the verses of the Shema, which declare the fundamentals of the Jewish faith: the unity of G-d ("Hear O Israel: the L-rd our G-d, the L-rd is one"); the mitzvot to love G-d, to study His Torah, and to bind "these words" as tefillin on our arms and heads, and inscribe them in the mezuzot affixed on the doorposts of our homes.

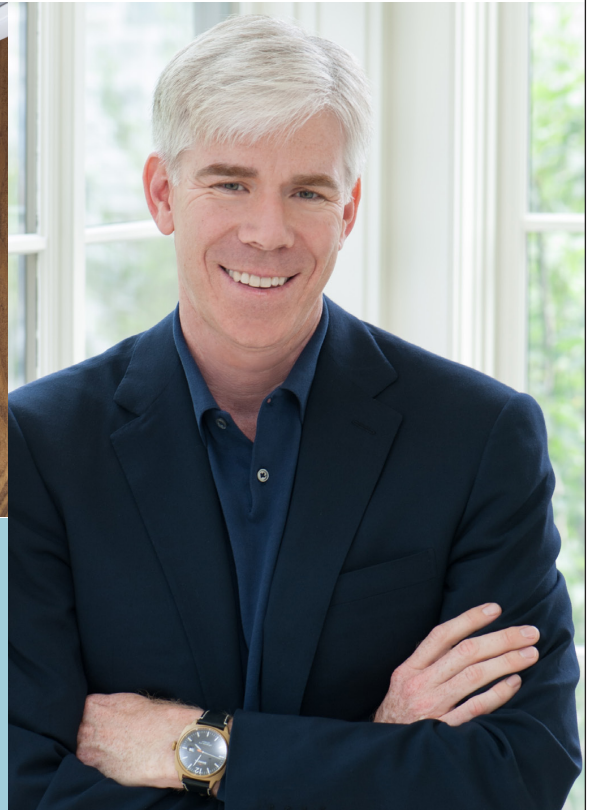

ROSENBLATT MEMORIAL LECTURE

The Rosenblatt Memorial Lecture will be held this Sunday, July 29th at Kneseth Israel. A light breakfast will be served at 10:15 a.m. and the lecture will begin at 11:00 a.m. Our feature speaker this year is CNN Political Analyst, David Gregory. It is sure to be a wonderful program as always.

David Gregory

David Gregory, a veteran broadcast journalist, is a political analyst on CNN and the host of a podcast featuring interviews with newsmakers and thought leaders. He is the author of a critically acclaimed memoir, "How's Your Faith?" which chronicles his efforts to deepen his own Jewish faith amid the rough and tumble of broadcast news.

Gregory was affiliated with NBC News for nearly 20 years. He was moderator of "Meet The Press" for six years and served as White House Correspondent during the entire tenure of President George W. Bush. He traveled with President Bush on 9-11, covered the wars in Afghanistan and Iraq, and contributed anchoring duties to all of the network's major programs, including "Today" and "Nightly News" and served as a political analyst.

At "Meet The Press," Gregory had a string of exclusive interviews that generated headlines around the world. Vice President Joe Biden discussed gay marriage on the program, representing a major shift by the Obama administration on gay marriage. He also broadcast from Afghanistan after holding the first interview with General David Petraeus following the general's taking up his position as leading U.S. forces there. During the 2012 campaign, Gregory moderated a debate among the Democratic and Republican candidates as part of a special broadcast.

A much sought-after speaker on politics, world affairs and faith, Gregory lives in Washington, D.C. with his wife, litigator Beth Wilkinson, and three children. He serves on the board of Martha's Table, a non-profit dedicated to strengthening families and feeding the poor in Washington, D.C.
